

IPHI provides technical assistance to health departments, local and state governments, community coalitions and others on Health in All Policies.



## Governance

Adopt local policy (e.g. resolution, ordinance, or other policy) to institutionalize HiAP.

Establish procedures for using HiAP lens to inform legislative and fiscal decision-making

Establish HiAP Interdepartmental Team to integrate HiAP principles into routine policies, programs, and practices.

### IPHI Roles:

Assist the drafting of policy language; Facilitate establishment and function of Interdepartmental Team.



## Training & Capacity Building

Educate elected officials, administration, community residents and partners regarding HiAP and its value in promoting health, equity and other local priorities

Workshops for policymakers, local agencies, departments, and offices on operationalizing HiAP across sectors.

### IPHI Roles:

Support local champions in educating key stakeholders; identify best practices for local adaptation; develop and facilitate in-depth implementation workshops.



## Community Engagement

Engage community partners, advocates and residents to collectively:

- 1) identify priorities;
- 2) provide input on jurisdictional policies, programs, and practices;
- 3) track progress in promoting health for all

**IPHI Roles:** Training and technical assistance on community engagement strategies; guidance in identifying priority populations; guidance in identification of target audiences, and affected communities.



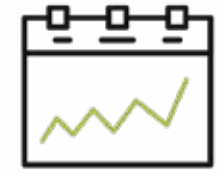
## Policy & Decision Making

Integrate HiAP lens across local government to build health and equity considerations into all decision-making.

Integrate HiAP lens into existing local priorities (e.g. strategic plans, community and economic development, education, comprehensive plans).

Utilize data and tools to support HiAP (e.g. Health Impact Assessment, Equity Impact Analysis).

**IPHI Roles:** Assist in operationalizing HiAP, adapting tools, integrating HiAP into existing priorities.



## Outcomes

Evaluate HiAP to document improvements in health and equity.

Process measures (e.g.): Increased communication and collaboration across sectors; reduced duplication.

Outcome measures (e.g.): Collaborative implementation of policies; changes in environments & social determinants.

Impact measures (e.g.): Improved health and well being of all residents and neighborhoods; reduced inequities.

**IPHI Roles:** Support in identifying appropriate metrics and data sources.
